Canadian Century Club Rules

a) General Rules

- The Canadian Century Club Award is available to any Amateur who has submitted satisfactory evidence to RAC showing two-way communication with at least 100 different Amateur stations in Canada.
- Of the 100 contacts, a minimum of 1 contact must be made with a station in each province, and 1 contact must be made with a station in any of the three territories.
- Of the 100 contacts, no more than 20 can be made with stations from a single province, and no more than 20 contacts can be made with stations located in any of the three territories.
- All contacts must be made after 1945.
- All contacts must be made from within the same DXCC entity.
- Contacts made by the same applicant using different callsigns are permitted, although proof is required showing the applicant was holder of that callsign at the time the contact was made.
- Contacts made with stations using the VE0 prefix do not count towards this award.
- Contacts using repeaters do not count towards this award.
- There are no endorsements available for the Canadian Century Club.

b) Application

- The applicant must complete and submit the Canadian Century Club application form to the RAC Awards Manager. The application contains the list of stations contacted along with the method of confirmation used.
- Acceptable confirmation methods for contacts are:

1) Paper QSL Card

- Paper QSL Cards must clearly show the date, time, frequency or band, mode of the QSO, as well as the province of the station contacted.

2) Logbook of the World

-LoTW confirmations must clearly show the date, time, frequency or band, mode of the QSO, as well as the province of the station contacted.

3) eqsl.cc

-eqsl.cc confirmations must be from stations having Authenticity Guaranteed status.

-eqsl.cc confirmations must clearly show the date, time, frequency or band, mode of the QSO, as well as the province of the station contacted.

4) qrz.com

-qrz.com confirmations must clearly show the date, time, frequency or band, mode of the QSO, as well as the province of the station contacted.

-Do not send QSL cards, card scans, LoTW confirmation screenshots, eqsl.cc screenshots or qrz.com screenshots.

-The application must be signed by two other amateur radio operators who are not related to the applicant, certifying that they have verified the QSL information and all other information on the application is correct and that all QSL cards and electronic confirmations are in the possession of the applicant.

-The RAC Awards Manager may ask the applicant for more proof at any time while reviewing the application. This could be in the form of QSL card scans, LoTW, eqsl.cc screenshots or qrz.com screenshots

c) Certificates

-The certificates are available as an emailed PDF file, or as a paper certificate mailed to the applicant.

-The certificates will be numbered and signed by the RAC Awards Manager. PDF certificates will also be digitally signed by the RAC Awards Manager.

d) Fees

-For the PDF certificate, the fee is \$5 CAD for Canadian stations and \$5 CAD for DX stations. This fee is subject to change at any time.

-For the paper certificate, the fee is \$10 CAD for Canadian stations and \$15 CAD for DX stations. This fee is subject to change at any time.

d) Publication

-The names of the award recipients will be periodically published in The Canadian Amateur magazine and will be available on the RAC website.
