

RAC Contest Managers: Jim Roberts, VE7ZO and Vlad Milutinovic, VE3JM



The Canada Day contest is RAC's way of celebrating the confederation of Canada and is always on July 1. This year we started on Tuesday evening in Canada, Wednesday UTC time, which was not a holiday or weekend for those outside of Canada. As a result, we were not expecting a record-breaking year, but nonetheless we did see a 15% increase in submitted logs year-over-year (YoY).

Even though we are experiencing diminishing high band openings on the downside of Cycle 25, we were hoping for some decent propagation but that turned out to be wishful thinking. Conditions were disturbed for much of the contest and many stations from VE3 to VE6 to FL had to contend with thunderstorms. This led to a reduced success rate for those that participated from outside of North America as well as lowering overall participation.

This year the Assisted categories (41% of logs) dominated entries, while Single Mode CW and PH (28.3%) were the next most favoured categories. This was the first year that a RAC Contest featured a Team Category comprised of up to four operators. The Flatlanders team – made up of VE5CPU, VE5SF, VE5MX and VE5UO – were the inaugural winners. Twelve teams were registered prior to the entry deadline. The Manitoulin Amateur Radio Club had four entries alone, with one of their members – Igor Slakva, VE3ZF – setting a new 2 metre record in the process.

We were glad to see some new contest operators in the Rookie and Team categories. Also, a big thanks to those multi-op entries that take the time to introduce and mentor new operators! There were no other new records set this year in any of the other available categories. With that introduction, on with the detailed results!

Single Operator All Bands – High Power (SOABHP)

Bart Ritchie, VE5CPU, takes top honours in the SOABHP category with a score of 160,908, earning the plaque sponsored by Radioworld. Mark Mattila, VA7MM, secured second place with a score of 95,830, while Dariusz Tatarski, VE3BR, claimed third with 60,106.

Single Operator All Bands – Low Power (SOABLP)

Art Boyars, K3KU, clinches first place in the SOABLP category with a score of 144,144, capturing the plaque sponsored by Contest Club Ontario and receives the Bart Ritchie, VE5CPU Plaque sponsored by Jim Roberts, VE7ZO – Foreign Entry (any power).

Sam Ferris, VE5SF, earned second place with a score of 102,600. Robert Melhado, WA2JQK, rounds out the top three with 59,576.

Single Operator – QRP (SOQRP)

Once again, Ron Baker, VE3SIF, wins the SOQRP category with a score of 64,534, earning the plaque sponsored by Radioworld. Anthony Buscaglia, K2NV, follows in second place with 13,794, while Arnold Love, VE3NFN takes third with a score of 10,268.

Single Operator All Bands – Phone (SOABPH)

Michael Ross, VE2NTT, secures first place once again in the SOABPH category with a score of 167,232, earning the plaque sponsored by the Maritime Contest Club. Congratulations on the three-peat! Alexander Sherman, W6AFA, repeats as second place with a score of 93,992, and Sunday Satiada, VE4SG also repeats, placing third with a score of 78,030.

Single Operator All Bands – CW (SOABCW)

After placing second last year, Stefan Bejusca, VA3AR leads the SOABCW category with a score of 164,260, winning the Gary Bartlett, VE1RGB Memorial Plaque, sponsored by the Maritime Contest Club. Eric Austin, VE6BBP, takes second place with a score of 138,548, and Mike Spenuk, VA3SP once again comes in third with 93,528.

Single Operator Assisted – High Power (SOAHP)

Ed Richardson, VE4VT, operating as VE4RAC, put out a strong effort in winning the SOAHP category with a winning score of 417,064, earning the plaque sponsored by Radioworld Central. Dick Van Zandt, K9OM, follows in second with 337,584, and Dave Scarfe, VE5UO takes third place with a score of 289,690.

Single Operator Assisted – Low Power (SOALP)

Igor Mordick, VA3FF, wins the SOALP category with a score of 221,272, earning the Radioworld Central-sponsored plaque. Thomas Sommers, WU8T, follows with 101,144, while Alex Malikov, VE3MA secures third with a score of 74,392.

Single Operator Single Band (SOSB)

As in past years, 20 metres was the most popular band in the SOSB category, producing the top three scores. Adrian Stimpson, VE7NZ, takes first place and the Radioworld-sponsored plaque with a score of 89,672. Jim Bearman, VE7SS, earns second with 36,900, and Kevin Clements, operating as VA7RCN/VA5, claims third place with a score of 26,000.

A full band-by-band breakdown with power levels is included later in this article for those who enjoy tracking these statistics, although they are not officially part of the contest scoring.

Multi-Operator Single Transmitter – High Power (MOSTHP)

The Kings County Amateur Radio Club team, operating VE1RAC, wins the MOSTHP category with a score of 319,928, capturing the plaque sponsored by Alfa Radio. Ethan Handwerker, N1SOH, places second with 22,700, and the Abbotsford Amateur Radio Emergency Services Society club operating VE7ECC, places third with 480 points.

Multi-Operator Single Transmitter – Low Power (MOSTLP)

Matthew McConnell, VA3UMM and his team led the MOSTLP category with a score of 195,960, earning the Tony Allsop – VE3FTA Memorial Plaque. Marcel Leblanc, VE9ML and his team followed in second place with a score of 88,968, while Don Winsor, W8UM, and his group, secured third with 45,600.

Multi-Operator Multi-Transmitter (MOMT)

Following their success in the RAC Canada Winter Contest, Duane Sandmeyer, VE7UF and his team operating as VE7RAC, captures the top spot in the MOMT category with a score of 689,136, earning the Radioworld-sponsored plaque. Don Whitty, VE9XX and his team operating as VE9RAC follows with 506,520, and the Surrey ARC operating VE7SAR, places third with a score of 232,956.

Rookie Category

The Rookie category is open to operators first licensed less than three years before the contest date, entering in these three categories: SOABHP, SOABLP or SOQRP. Unfortunately, there were no qualifying Rookie entries this year. While eight participants claimed Rookie status, they entered non-eligible categories for this award.

Top Scoring Single Operator – Foreign Entry

As highlighted in the SOABLP results, Art Boyars, K3KU, takes home the Bart Ritchie, VE5CPU, Plaque sponsored by Jim Roberts, VE7ZO, for the Top Scoring Single Operator – Foreign Entry (any power), with a score of 144,144. **Note:** Assisted category entries are not eligible for this plaque due to its traditional focus on non-assisted efforts.

Teams

As noted previously, The Flatlanders team – comprised of VE5CPU, VE5SF, VE5MX and VE5UO – took top spot with a combined score of 608,588. Contest Club Ontario #1, VE3ZR and VA3AR took second place with a combined score of 358,080, and the Manitoulin Amateur Radio Club Team #1 won third place with a combined score of 238,814.
