

RAC CANADA DAY CONTEST – 2018 RESULTS

Once again, we celebrated Canada Day with our usual summer Canadian contest. Falling on a Sunday this year provided opportunities for even casual contestants to spend some time exchanging QSOs with folks in Canada and around the world. With over 550 participants it was one of the best ever turnouts in recent years despite the poor propagation conditions. Propagation was an even bigger challenge outside of North America, although comments from various regions in North America indicated challenges for some. For those that persevered through the poor propagation, our thanks for your support!

Despite challenging conditions, in terms of propagation, we have two new records set in the Canada Day Contest. Yuri Onipko, VE3DZ, sets a new record for SOABCW with a score of 268,992 making 1,264 QSOs and gathering 48 mults; and VA3RAC sets a new record for MOSTLP with a score of 454,256 making 955 QSOs and picking up 88 mults. Excellent job by both in this part of the solar cycle! With that bit of introduction, on with the detailed results!

Single Op All Bands High Power

Tom Haavisto, VE3CX, wins the SOABHP plaque sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 741,030. Victor Petcherkin, WQ5OO, moves to second place when compared to last year with a score of 573,000 and once again takes the Larry Kayser, VA3LK Memorial Plaque sponsored by Alan Goodacre, VE3HX, for the Top Scoring Single Operator's Foreign Entry – any authorized power. Mitch Mason, K7RL, repeats his performance from last year and takes third place with a score of 300,960.

Single Op All Bands Low Power

Gabor Horvath, VE7JH, using the call sign XL75A, piloted his station to another first place finish this year in the SOABLP category and takes the plaque sponsored by Contest Club Ontario with a score of 258,216. Doug Ferris, VA3DF, takes second place this year with a score of 205,086. Third place goes to Axel Bruderer, KI6RRN, generating a score of 174,652.

Single Op – QRP

For the fifth year in a row – an extraordinary rare run in our contest – Thomas J. Warren, K3TW, takes the first place plaque in the SOABQRP category sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 41,440. Congratulations Thomas! This is a change in sponsorship of this plaque and the contest team thanks Radioworld for their generous support of plaques for the RAC contests. Second place goes to another repeat winner, David Stephenson, VE3PGY, with a score of 27,608. Third place goes to Lawrence Appelbaum, AD0BI, with a score of 4,080 points.

Gordon Hunter, VE6WZL, takes first place with a score of 81,950 capturing the SOABPH plaque sponsored by the Maritime Contest Club. Second place goes to the Monkey Lovers Radio Consortium, K6MMM, piloted by Rich Seifert, KE1B, with a score of 71,632. Tim Gregory, VA3TIC, rounds out third place with a score of 53,404.

Single Op All Band CW

Yuri Onipko, VE3DZ, takes first place and sets a new Canada Day record in this category with a score of 268,992 capturing the SOABCW plaque sponsored by the Maritime Contest Club. Second place goes to Victor Androsov, VA2WA, with a score of 247,204 with Steve Bolia, N8BJQ, rounding out third place with a score of 114,730.

Single Op Single Band

Given where we are in a sunspot cycle, 20 metres continues to be the main band for those in the SOSB category and again produced the top three scores in this category. Robert Nash, VE3KZ, takes first place, winning the SOSB plaque sponsored by Radioworld, with a score of 111,600. Bj Madsen, VE5FX, moves up to second place from his third place finish last year with a score of 44,798. Our top three rounds out with Don Fisher, VE3ESE, with a score of 33,072.

The complete listing on page 6 shows the band by band breakdown and power levels for those who like to keep track of that element of SOSB even though it is not an official part of the contest format.

Multi-Operator Single-Transmitter High Power

Gord Kosmenko, VE6SV, and the team takes first place in the MOSTHP category. They capture the Alfa Radio sponsored plaque with a score of 667,602. Ed Richardson, VE4EAR and his team takes second place with a score of 477,004. Guy Lemieux, VE2BWL, takes third place this year with a score of 302,430. It should be noted that some entries in this class are a single operator who is using one of the methods that make them assisted and hence fall into the multi-operator category.

Multi-Operator Single-Transmitter Low Power

Igor Slakva, VE3ZF and his team, using the VA3RAC call sign, takes first place this year with a score of 454,256 capturing the MOSTLP Tony Allsop, VE3FTA Memorial Plaque. The team also sets a new Canada Day record in this category. Marcel LeBlanc, VE9ML and the team using the VE9RAC call sign, takes second place with a score of 316,234. Third place this year goes to Dave Tucker, KA6BIM and team with a score of 247,904. It should be noted that some entries in this class are a single

Multi-Operator Multi-Transmitter

Ken Keeler, N6RO and the team takes first place this year in the MO-MT category, taking the plaque sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 737,048. The Calgary ARA, using the VE6RAC call sign, take second place with a score of 431,946. Our third-place finish goes to the Sask Alta Contesters group using the VE5RAC callsign with a score of 405,304.

Top Scoring Single operator – Foreign entry

As noted in the SOABHP results, Victor Petcherkin, WQ5OO wins the Larry Kayser, VA3LK Memorial Plaque sponsored by Alan Goodacre, VE3HX, for the Top Scoring Single Operator's Foreign Entry – any authorized power. This is the second year in a row that Victor has captured this award.

If you are not submitting a Cabrillo log, we ask that you include a summary sheet providing the required information and, where possible, a breakdown of VE, RAC and DX contacts as well as the multiplier total. This will make compiling and checking of logs a bit easier and aids to a quicker turnaround of the results.

As a reminder, when submitting email entries, please make the subject line meaningful. Our preference is Call – Category – RAC Canada Day. For example: VE5CPU – SOABHP – RAC Canada Day.

The RAC Contest Management team continues to get the results out as quickly as possible with as much accuracy as we can. In the event we have let any errors in, please accept our apologies and be assured we will be happy to correct any problems that are identified and publish any updates on the RAC website.


