

– RAC Canada Day Contest 2020 Results: Updated May 28 –

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With Canada Day falling on a Wednesday this year and the COVID-19 pandemic having an impact worldwide, it was gratifying to see so many still able to participate in the RAC Canada Day Contest. While not being a holiday outside of Canada we thank those that took the time to join us in the celebration and exchanging greetings.

With over 735 participants it was the one of the best ever turnouts in recent years despite the ongoing poor solar conditions and resulting propagation. Our thanks to all those who participated and we hope you all have been staying as safe as possible during this very trying time.

SINGLE OP ALL BANDS HIGH POWER

Todd Bendtsen, VE5MX, wins the SOABHP plaque sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 753,168. Victor Petcherkin, N8OO, takes second with a score of 694,230 and once again takes the Larry Kayser, VA3LK Memorial Plaque, sponsored by Alan Goodacre, VE3HX, for the Top Scoring Single Operator's Foreign Entry – Any Authorized Power. Tom Haavisto, VE3CX, takes third place with a score of 484,110.

SINGLE OP ALL BANDS LOW POWER

Bob Hawkin, VE3WG, piloted his station to a first place finish this year in the SOABLP category and takes the plaque, sponsored by Contest Club Ontario, with a score of 185,968. Art Boyars, K3KU, takes second place this year with a score of 111,198. Third place goes to Barry Middlebrook, VE6TN, with a score of 104,058.

SINGLE OP – QRP

Thomas Warren, K3TW, is the category winner and takes the first place plaque in the SOABQRP category sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 46,530. David Stephenson, VE3PYG, takes second place with a score of 15,600 while third place goes to Piet Natte, VE9BWK, with a score of 7,728.

SINGLE OP ALL BAND PHONE

Igor Slakva, VE3ZF, takes first place with a score of 192,126 capturing the SOABPH plaque sponsored by the Maritime Contest Club. Second place goes to Ed Richardson, VE4VT, with a score of 190,994. Victor Paul, WB0TEV, rounds out third place with a score of 168,234.

SINGLE OP SINGLE BAND

Once again this year, 20 metres continues to be the main band for those in the SOSB category and it produced the top three scores in this category. Gary Caldwell, VA7RR, takes first place, winning the SOSB plaque sponsored by Radioworld with a score of 175,200. Bob Nash, VE3KZ, takes second place with a score of 92,506 and Sylvain Labre, VA3SY, takes third place this year with a score of 28,950.

The complete listing provided on page 5 shows the band by band breakdown and power levels for those who like to keep track of that element of SOSB even though it is not an official part of the contest format.

MULTI-OPERATOR SINGLE-TRANSMITTER HIGH POWER

Dave Heumann, N7NR, and the team operating at WA6TQT, take first place in the MOSTHP category. They capture the Alfa Radio sponsored plaque with a score of 669,222.

Gord Kosmenko, VE6SV and the team, operating as VE6RAC, take second place with a score of 614,052.

Guy Lemieux, VE2BWL and the team, using the VA2UR call, take third place this year with a score of 188,936.

MULTI-OPERATOR SINGLE-TRANSMITTER LOW POWER

Marcel LeBlanc, VE9ML and the team, using the VE9RAC call, take first place this year with a score of 272,924 and capture the MOSTLP Tony Allsop, VE3FTA, Memorial plaque. Jerome Spring, VE6TL, takes second place this year with a score of 144,144. Third place goes to Mike Goldstein, VE3GFN, with a score of 88,560.

MULTI-OPERATOR MULTI-TRANSMITTER

David Jaffe, WD6T and the team at N6RO take first place this year with a score of 728,928 and capture the MOMT plaque sponsored by Radioworld. Larry Anderson, KD5DD, and his team take second place with a score of 501,542. Our third place finish goes to Fred Orsetti, VE7IO and the team using the VE7RAC call, with a score of 367,714.

TOP SCORING SINGLE OPERATOR – FOREIGN ENTRY

As noted in the SOABHP results, Victor Petcherkin, N8OO, wins the Larry Kayser, VA3LK Memorial plaque sponsored by Alan Goodacre, VE3HX, for the Top Scoring Single Operator's Foreign Entry – Any Authorized Power. This is the fourth year in a row that Victor has captured this award. Great effort once again Victor!

A Cabrillo-formatted electronic log submission really helps to manage the work to compile the contest results. Although we encourage electronic logs, we will continue to accept paper logs for small entries (less than 100 contacts).

If you are not submitting a Cabrillo log, we ask that those entrants include a summary sheet providing the required information and where possible, a breakdown of VE, RAC and DX contacts as well as the multiplier total. This will make compiling and checking of logs a bit easier and aids to a quicker turnaround of the results.

As a reminder, when submitting email entries, please make the subject line meaningful. Our preference is Call – Category – RAC Canada Day. For example: VE5CPU – SOABHP – RAC Canada Day.
